



Sunday School has officially started!

Who? Children and Youth from age five and older.

When? 10:00 – am until the The Greeting of the Peace, at which time the children will rejoin their parents in the Church with an adult escort.

Where? Kirk Hall for now – because it is air conditioned and out in the open. Some Sundays there may only be one or two children, and for safety reasons – it is not wise to have Sunday School upstairs in isolation. When our numbers grow, we will gladly move to the newly painted Sunday School rooms upstairs and will ask the Sexton to turn on the AC upstairs. For now, parents will drop off their children in Kirk Hall with Dr. Tomalesky

What is the Curriculum? The curriculum will follow the Lectionary and will parallel what the adults are hearing in Church. The Psalm, Old Testament Reading, The Epistle, and The Gospel will be read from a Children's Bible – which is in language that the children can understand. Then there will be a Question and Answer teaching on the meaning of the lessons. Second, there will be a story read from a book of famous Bible Stories. Sunday School will be a time for learning about God's Word and Message in a fun format. For example – for the story of Adam and Eve we may make paper puppets and put on a play using shoe box dioramas. The fun format will vary week to week – sometimes word searches, sometimes a cut/paste activity, or perhaps cutting or coloring activity. All activities will relate to the Lectionary Lessons or the Bible Story for that week. The first Sunday of every month is Youth Sunday where the children and youth WILL CONTINUE TO serve in such important tasks as ushers, greeters, altar assistants, lectors, and bring gifts to the new comers in the pews.
